A recent article in the **Orange County Register** caused strong concern in El Sauzal supporters. It began with the following:

“El Sauzal Orphanage near Ensenada, Mexico, may be in jeopardy of closing its doors if the steady flow of U.S. volunteers on which it has relied for decades dwindles to a trickle, a possibility triggered by escalating violence in the region.” [Carcamo, Cindy. “Travel alerts scare 2 nations.” The Orange County Register. March 13, 2009, pg 1]

Every ministry in Baja has been affected by the crime in Tijuana and Rosarito. There are fewer volunteers coming. With the current world economy, donations are down as well. Financial and in-kind gifts to El Sauzal are down over this time last year.

I am frequently asked about the safety of traveling in Mexico. I reply that I personally have no fear nor am I concerned for my safety while traveling in Mexico. I clarify that I am careful where I go and when I go. I

try not to drive at night, and I do not venture into areas that I am not familiar with. The problem is between drug dealers and drug cartels fighting each other, and their battles against the police and military who are trying to restore order.

I would like to share a verse from the Bible. *“But the Lord said to me, “Do not say, I am only a child [or in my case, I am too old]. You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and I will rescue you, declares the Lord.” -Jeremiah 1:7-8*

I believe that I am an example of this promise. The Lord has gone with me and protected me for 30 years in hundreds of trips to Baja, and I believe that He will do the same for anyone whom He calls to go minister in Mexico.

Is the El Sauzal Orphanage in jeopardy of closing? “This is God’s business,” Josue Espinoza said recently. *No, we are not in jeopardy of closing*, but we do strongly need your continued prayers and support.

enough. She tried to be a good steward and to be faithful in remembering the children. Often she would include a note expressing her prayers for God's blessing.

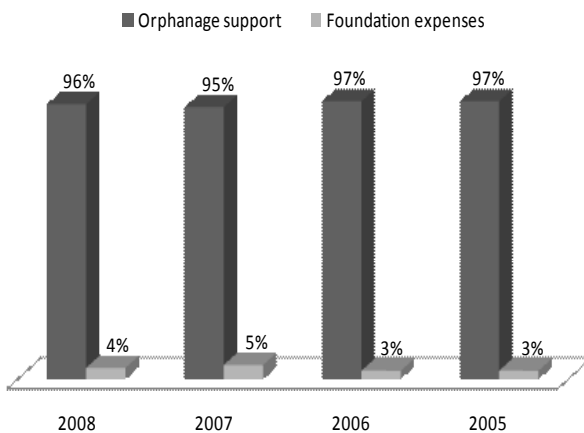

Remembering Isela

On January 19th, (Juana) Isela, the Orphanage's cook of many years, was in a tragic automobile accident. Isela, her husband, and their two youngest sons were driving along the steep, curving road that connects the toll road to San Antonio de Las Minas. Their car went off the road, falling about 280 feet and crashing against the big rocks at the bottom. Isela was thrown from the car and passed away. Her husband Jose Luis and the two boys, Natan and Jacob, were injured, but not seriously. The older children, America and David, were in school.

The news deeply shook the Orphanage and the little community of San Antonio. Many people attended Isela's wake and church and graveside ceremonies. Grown Orphanage kid Norma came forward to fill Isela's role as the cook.

Across the border in the United States, the news spread quickly. We posted the information on Facebook for the "Friends of El Sauzal Orphanage" group and sent out a mass email (see below). Quickly, messages from across the U.S. and Canada came pouring in, expressing sympathy, prayers and support.

We miss Isela greatly, but we are joyful that she is in heaven, and we will see her again.

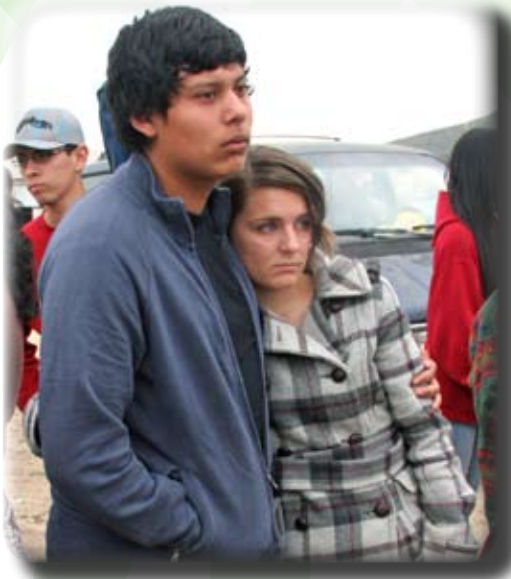

Rejoin the grocery program

Even if you have previously signed up to help El Sauzal with your grocery card, Ralphs and Albertsons need you to re-register.

Here is an easy way to support the Orphanage through Albertsons and Ralph grocery stores' rebate programs. You will receive discounts, and both grocery chains will send a percentage of your purchase to the charity of your choice. The two chains are requiring all those who wish to support a charity to re-register their grocery card.

Albertsons
